
Dorridge and District Residents Association Henlev-in-Arden to Irelands Farm

This walk of about 4 miles starts from behind the High Street and loops north and then east through farmland. Although it is mainly farmland, it is a walk where you will see kestrels and buzzards and perhaps even some deer near Irelands Farm. It returns over the site of Beaudesert Castle which rises to the east of Henley.

The walk start from a free car park near the Henley Medical Centre. Coming down the A3400 from the north, at the traffic lights at the far end of the High Street, turn left and pass the Ford garage. Take the next left, Prince Harry Way and follow the car park signs through the rat run until you find the car park. (I do not recommend parking on the High Street itself as there is a 2 hour parking limit).



The walk has a number of stiles, nothing too challenging and is dog friendly - nothing a reasonable sized dog cannot scramble under.



Having parked in the car park, leave by the path at the rear, by the medical centre, past some swings on your right and a pond on vour left.

9. Walk along After leaving the buildings, pass by the brick wall of an old railway viaduct, and shortly after on the right there is a waymarked footpath which we take.	
11. Follow the path across the fields The path crosses fields, slowly drifting to the left, through a stile.	12. Follow the same line Aim for the end of the hedge on the left which turns away.
13. Find the gate in the corner As the hedge turns the corner, follow it to a kissing gate. The path continues to the right, keeping to the fence, heading for the right of the house ahead.	

15. Turn left at the road The path emerges at a lane. Turn left and follow to a junction.	16. Go to the right of the white houseContinue forwards, passing the junction. Note: the footpath we are heading for was diverted a few years ago, and maps may show the maps!
17. Find the path on the right After the junction, there is a stile on the right. We head straight up to the top of the hill, through a couple of gates.	
19. Bear left Cross the stile. The path bears left to a field	20. Cross the field The path heads straight across just to the left of the clump of trees ahead.
21. Follow the field to the corner At the corner of the field, pass through to the next field.	22. Go through the gap After a gnarly tree, the path takes to the right of the hedge. Follow the edge of the field, with the hedge on your left.

25. Continue the same line The track continues up towards and to the left of the farm buildings. As it rises up the hill, a new fence starts and the path follows on the field side of this	26. At top corner, turn right As you reach the top of the field, the hedge bends to the left. Just at this point, the shrubbery ends, and there is a gap in the hedge to join the entrance to Irelands Farm.
27. Turn right to Irelands Farm Follow the gravely track until the building directly in front of the path.	28. Take the grassy track left As you arrive at the various converted houses, take the wide track to the left. (Note to dog owners: although mainly arable, the farm here has loose proper control on leads).
29. Follow the track until a farm gate The track eventually reaches a metal farm gate. Pass through and continue across the filed on the same line. The fallen tree has been there a couple of years and seems unlikely to go any time soon – its good habitat.	30 Cross stile and bear right On the far side of the field, go though a gate and cross the stile, then follow the field edge, bearing slightly right.
31. At track turn right The path arrives at a farm lane. Cross the stile and turn right. <i>Note: if you did the Claverdon to Lowsonford walk, you might recognise that this track is walked in the other direction.</i>	32. Cross the bridge Crossing the bridge, which is over the same long abandoned line as mentioned in step 9, continue on until you meet the road.
33. Turn right Turning right, follow the road round the bend to another footpath on your right.	34. Up track to hedge Turning up the farm drive, cross the cattle grid and follow to just past the hedge ahead.
